

# Accountability for Safety Hazards in Optical Cables



## Article Overview

### Management Responsibilities

Management holds primary accountability for establishing a safe work environment. Additionally, management must maintain first aid kits, emergency equipment, and incident reporting systems to address accidents promptly .

### Technician Responsibilities

Technicians are accountable for following established safety protocols during installation, splicing, and maintenance. This includes:

- Eye protection: Never looking directly into fiber ends or lasers; using optical power meters or visual fault locators .
