Understanding Access Switch Traces

An access switch is a network edge device that connects end-user devices such as computers, IP phones, cameras, and IoT devices to the network. It operates at the access layer and forwards traffic upstream to distribution or core switches while handling VLANs, PoE, and local traffic forwarding . Because it directly interfaces with endpoints, it maintains records of connected devices, which can be considered "traces."

Methods to Identify Connected Devices

- **MAC Address Table Lookup:** Access switches maintain a table of MAC addresses associated with each port. By logging into the switch and running commands like `show mac address-table`, you can see which devices are connected to which ports .
- **ARP Table Inspection:** If the switch has an IP address, you can check the ARP table to map IP addresses to MAC addresses. This helps identify devices connected to the switch and their corresponding IPs .
- **SNMP Monitoring:** Managed switches often support SNMP, which allows network administrators to query the switch for connected devices, port statistics, and traffic patterns .
- **Port Mirroring (SPAN):** To capture live traffic, you can configure port mirroring on the access switch. This duplicates traffic from one or more ports to a monitoring device, allowing detailed packet-level analysis .
