Purpose of the Connection

Equipment and Adapters

To connect a conduit to a cable tray, specialized adapters and clamps are used:

- Conduit-to-tray adapters: These allow rigid, IMC, or EMT conduits to connect securely to cable trays ().
- Cable tray clamps: Malleable iron clamps with U-bolts and nuts secure the conduit at right angles to the tray, ensuring stability and grounding ().
- Flex tray connectors: Used for flexible tray systems to accommodate slight misalignments or movement ().

Installation Guidelines

- Maintain Free Air Space: Ensure 1-3 feet of free air between the tray and conduit to prevent cable damage during transition ().
- Inspect Materials: Check all trays, conduits, and accessories for damage before installation ().
