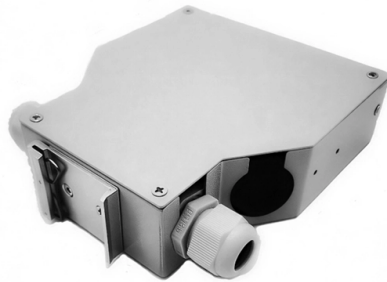


# Cable tray reserved space



## Article Overview

Cable tray reserved space is the portion of the tray left unfilled to ensure proper ventilation, safety, and future expansion, typically 40% for power cables and 50% for control or signal cables according to NEC standards.

### NEC Guidelines for Reserved Space

The National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 392 specifies that power cables in cable trays should not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area, while control, instrumentation, or signal cables can occupy up to 50% of the tray area. This reserved space ensures adequate airflow for heat dissipation, prevents overheating, and allows for future cable additions without overcrowding. Metallic trays may also serve as grounding conductors if installed according to NEC requirements.

### Practical Design Considerations

- **Tray Fill Calculation:** The fill ratio is calculated by dividing the total cable cross-sectional area by the tray's usable area. A 20% void factor is often included to account for air gaps between round cables.
- **Future Expansion:** Best practice is to design with an initial fill target below the maximum allowable limit (e.g., 30–40% for power cables) to accommodate future growth.
- **Cable Separation:** High-power and low-power cables should be separated to reduce electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain signal integrity.
- **Tray Type and Material:** Ventilated, ladder, or solid-bottom trays affect airflow and fill capacity. Material selection (aluminum, steel, FRP) depends on environmental conditions and load requirements.
