

Cable trays and cable tray distance



Article Overview

The recommended distance between parallel cable trays is generally 0.6 meters, with specific spacing adjustments for power and signal trays or when shielding is used.

Horizontal Spacing Between Cable Trays

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the minimum horizontal distance should be 0.6 meters. This spacing ensures adequate maintenance access, inspection, and airflow for heat dissipation, while reducing the risk of cables touching and potential short circuits or interference. For power and signal cable trays, the horizontal separation should generally be at least 0.5 meters to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to less than 0.3 meters, as shielding helps contain EMI.

Vertical Spacing Between Cable Trays

For floor-mounted or stacked cable trays, the minimum vertical clearance should be 150 millimeters. This prevents obstruction, maintains structural integrity, and allows for future installation of additional trays or cables while facilitating ventilation and cooling.

Spacing Relative to Pipes and Other Utilities

Cable trays must also maintain safe distances from pipes, especially those carrying heat, corrosive liquids, or gases. Recommended safety distances include:

- Thermal pipes with insulation: at least 0.5 meters parallel spacing
- Thermal pipes without insulation: at least 1 meter
- Common process pipes (e.g., compressed air): at least 0.4 meters
