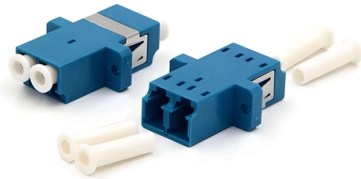


Can I connect my router directly to the internet via fiber optic cable

You cannot connect a standard router directly to a fiber optic cable; an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is required to convert the optical signal into an electrical signal that your router can use.

Why an ONT is Necessary

Fiber optic internet transmits data as light signals, which standard routers cannot interpret directly. The ONT, typically provided and installed by your ISP, serves as the conversion device, translating the optical signals from the fiber into electrical signals via Ethernet that your router can understand and distribute to devices . Without this conversion, the router cannot process the fiber signal.

How the Connection Works

- **Fiber Cable to ONT:** The fiber optic cable from your ISP connects to the ONT's optical port. This port receives the light signal and converts it into an electrical signal using a photodiode .
- **ONT to Router:** An Ethernet cable links the ONT's Ethernet output to your router's WAN port. This allows the router to manage your home network and provide internet access to multiple devices .
- **Router Configuration:** Once connected, the router may require configuration for VLAN, DHCP, or PPPoE settings depending on your ISP .
