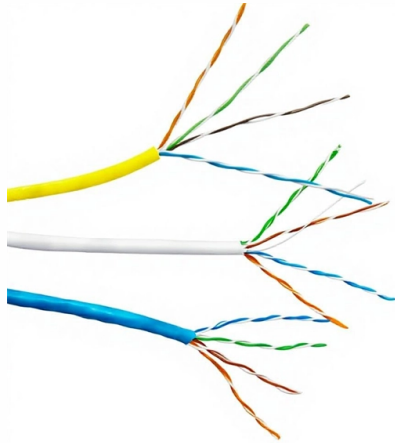

Quality of Service (QoS) for Bandwidth Allocation

QoS allows core switches to classify, prioritize, and schedule traffic based on type, importance, or source. Using tools like Cisco's Modular QoS CLI (MQC), administrators can define traffic classes and attach policies that allocate bandwidth to critical applications, such as VoIP, video conferencing, or industrial PLC control instructions. Key strategies include:

- Priority-based bandwidth guarantees: Reserve minimum bandwidth for critical traffic to prevent delays or packet loss.
- Dynamic bandwidth adjustment: Modify allocations in real-time based on traffic demand to optimize utilization.
