Overview

Electrical panel boxes, aka breaker boxes, can be on a wall in an out-of-the-way area of your home. Current National Electrical Codes (NEC) allow none of these. The placement of electrical equipment must minimize hazards and allow for immediate, safe access for maintenance or emergency shut-off. The requirements of Rules 2-308 and 2-310 are particular to certain types of equipment (i. equipment with or without draw-out parts). To. Specific guidelines, like the ESA bulletin 2-9-9 working space and the NEC code for electrical panel clearance, define the mandatory space in front of your electrical panel for a reason. This isn't just about passing inspections—it's about ensuring technicians can work safely and you have access in. That box must stay completely clear—no shelves, pipes, or storage—so an electrician can work safely without risk of contact with live parts or losing footing.
