Cold aisle containment (CAC) directs cool air to server intakes, while hot aisle containment (HAC) captures and channels hot exhaust air; both aim to improve cooling efficiency and reduce energy costs.

Overview of Aisle Configurations

Cold Aisle Containment (CAC) involves enclosing the cold aisles where server fronts face each other. Cool air from the raised floor or overhead ducts is contained within this aisle, ensuring servers receive consistent, low-temperature air. Hot air is then expelled into the surrounding room and returned to cooling units. CAC is generally easier to retrofit in existing data centers and can be implemented without extensive architectural changes, making it cost-effective for upgrades. Hot Aisle Containment (HAC) encloses the hot aisles where server exhausts are directed. The hot air is captured and ducted back to the CRAC/CRAH units, preventing it from mixing with the cold supply air. HAC often provides better thermal efficiency and can improve Power Usage Effectiveness (PUE) by allowing higher return-air temperatures, which increases cooling system efficiency.
