

Cold Aisle of Communication Equipment Room

A cold aisle is a designated corridor in a data center where cooled air is delivered directly to the front of server racks to maintain optimal operating temperatures and prevent hot air recirculation.

Overview

In a communication equipment room or data center, cold aisles are formed by arranging server racks so that the fronts of the racks face each other, creating a corridor where cold air from cooling units is supplied directly to the equipment intakes. After passing through the servers, the air absorbs heat and exits through the back into the adjacent hot aisle, preventing hot and cold air from mixing.

Cold Aisle Containment (CAC)

Cold aisle containment involves enclosing the cold aisle using doors at the ends, ceiling panels, or structural frames to trap cold air and ensure it flows directly into the server intakes. This containment strategy:

- Maintains consistent inlet temperatures for IT equipment, reducing thermal stress and extending equipment lifespan.
- Eliminates hot spots by creating uniform airflow and predictable cooling conditions.
- Improves energy efficiency, as cooling units do not need to compensate for air recirculation, potentially reducing energy costs by up to 30%.
