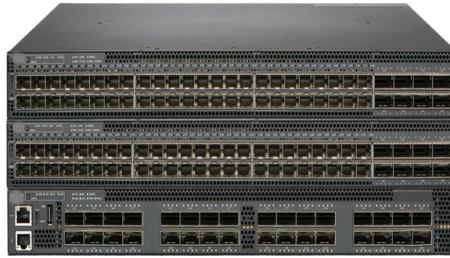


Do ground-mounted cable trays need to be fixed

Yes, ground-mounted cable trays must be properly fixed and grounded to ensure mechanical stability and electrical safety.

Mechanical Fixing

Ground-mounted cable trays need to be securely anchored to the floor or supporting structures to prevent movement, tipping, or vibration that could damage cables or compromise safety. Bolted connections, brackets, or support posts are commonly used to fix the trays in place. Proper fixing ensures that the trays can safely support the weight of the cables and withstand environmental forces such as wind or accidental impact, especially in industrial or outdoor installations .

Grounding and Bonding

All metallic cable trays must be grounded, regardless of whether they are used as an equipment grounding conductor (EGC) or not, as required by NEC Article 250.96 . Grounding provides a low-impedance path for fault currents, protecting personnel and equipment from electrical hazards, including electric shock, fire, and equipment damage . Key grounding practices include:

- Bonding tray sections together using grounding clamps or jumpers to maintain electrical continuity .
- Using a separate EGC conductor inside or attached to the tray if the tray is not rated as an EGC .
