Fiber optic sensors, including fiber optic current sensors (FOCS), function by transmitting light through an optical fiber and detecting changes in light properties such as polarization, phase, or intensity caused by external physical phenomena . In the case of current measurement, the sensor detects the magnetic field generated by an external electrical current using the Faraday effect, which rotates the polarization of light passing through the fiber . The fiber itself is an excellent electrical insulator, and no electrical current flows inside the optical fiber .
