

Fiber Optic Cable Conduit Fixation in Walls

Fiber optic cables should be installed in properly sized and secured conduits, with fixation points along walls to maintain bend radius, prevent stress, and ensure long-term protection.

Conduit Selection and Wall Mounting

Fiber optic cables are highly sensitive to bending, pulling, and crushing forces, so installing them inside a conduit is essential for protection against physical damage, moisture, pests, and accidental impacts during construction or maintenance .

Common conduit materials for wall installations include:

- PVC (Schedule 40 or 80): Lightweight, corrosion-resistant, and easy to mount on walls. Schedule 80 is preferred in areas with potential mechanical impact .
- HDPE: Flexible and suitable for longer runs or curved wall paths, often used with innerducts for multiple cables .
- Rigid Galvanized Steel (RGS): Required in industrial or fire-rated areas, providing maximum protection but heavier and more difficult to fix to walls .

Fixation Techniques

When mounting conduits on walls, follow these best practices:

- Use appropriate clamps or brackets: Secure the conduit at regular intervals to prevent sagging and maintain alignment. For vertical runs, clamps should support the conduit weight and prevent movement .
