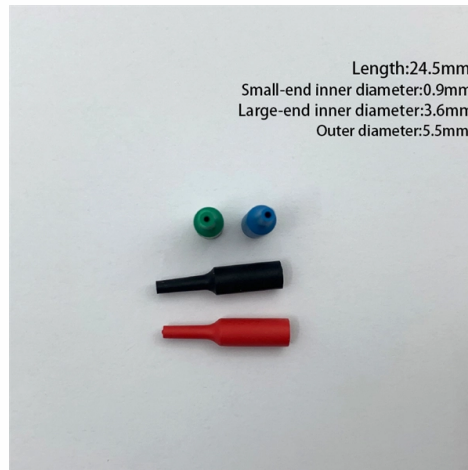


Fiber Optic Communication and Fiber Optic Information Network

Fiber optic communication transmits data as light through optical fibers, forming the backbone of modern high-speed information networks.

Fiber Optic Communication

Fiber optic communication is a method of transmitting information by sending pulses of infrared or visible light through an optical fiber, which acts as a carrier wave modulated to carry data such as voice, video, and telemetry signals (). The process involves converting electrical signals into light at the transmitter, sending the light through the fiber using total internal reflection, and converting it back to electrical signals at the receiver (). Total internal reflection occurs because the fiber core has a higher refractive index than the surrounding cladding, keeping light confined within the core (). Optical fibers are typically made of ultra-pure glass or plastic, with diameters comparable to a human hair, and are protected by buffer coatings and jackets to prevent damage (). This structure allows light to travel at speeds up to two-thirds the speed of light, enabling extremely fast data transmission ().
