They serve as a centralized point for incoming and outgoing fibers, providing cable management, splicing trays, and connector adapters. Terminal boxes can be wall-mounted, rack-mounted, or outdoor-rated, with features like dust-proof covers, IP65/IP68 protection, and lockable doors for environmental and mechanical protection.
