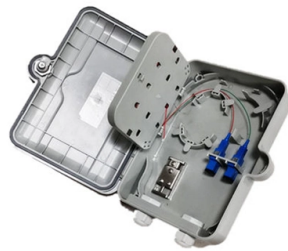

Fiber Optic Connectors

Definition and Purpose: Fiber optic connectors are mechanical devices that join optical fibers, allowing light to pass through with minimal insertion loss and high return loss. They enable easy connection and disconnection, unlike permanent splicing, and are essential for network flexibility and maintenance .

- Key Components:**
- **Ferrule:** A precision cylinder (usually ceramic) that holds the fiber core.
 - **Connector Body:** Houses the ferrule and attaches to the cable.
 - **Coupling Mechanism:** Locks the connector in place (push-pull, latch, bayonet, or screw) .
- Common Types:**
- **LC (Lucent Connector):** Small 1.25mm ferrule, latch mechanism, ideal for high-density data centers and SFP/SFP+ transceivers .
 - **SC (Subscriber Connector):** 2.5mm ferrule, push-pull design, widely used in FTTH and telecom networks .
 - **ST (Straight Tip):** 2.5mm ferrule, bayonet twist-lock, durable for industrial and legacy networks .
