

Fiber optic cable duct well blocked

Fiber optic duct blockages are typically caused by debris, crushed sections, or construction materials, and can often be resolved using inspection, rodding, or targeted civil works.

Causes of Duct Blockage

Blockages in fiber optic ducts commonly occur due to sand, stones, construction debris, or crushed duct sections during installation or subsequent civil works. Builders or groundworks can inadvertently cover or damage ducts, preventing cables from being pulled through. Over time, silt or other debris may accumulate, especially in older or poorly maintained ducts.

Inspection and Diagnosis

Before attempting to clear a blockage, it is essential to inspect the duct to locate the obstruction and assess duct integrity. Specialist services use high-definition CCTV robotic crawlers to provide real-time video of the duct interior, identifying collapsed sections, debris, or structural damage. This inspection ensures that any unblocking effort does not damage the fiber cable or worsen the duct condition.

Methods to Clear Blockages

- **Rodding:** A flexible rod is inserted from access points to locate the blockage. The rod stops at the obstruction, allowing precise identification of the problem area.
- **Draw Rope Installation:** Once the duct is clear, a rope (often 6 mm nylon) is pulled through to facilitate cable installation.
