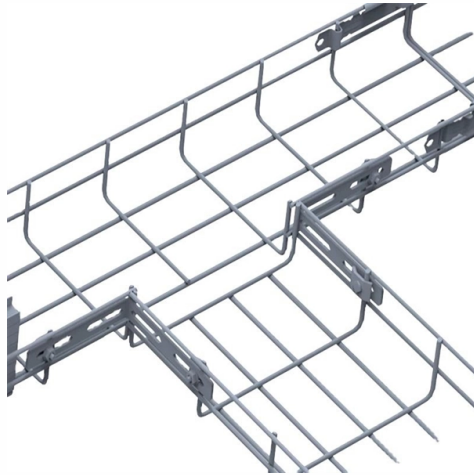


How long should the jumper wire be left in the distribution box



Overview

The National Electrical Code (NEC) requires at least six inches of free conductor length, measured from the point where the wire emerges from the box. The length of wire left inside an electrical box is a matter of strict compliance, safety, and functionality. You may also want. Arrangement order: The circuit breakers should be arranged from left to right, and the reserved position is generally placed on the right side of the distribution box. Wire color: The neutral wire is blue, and the color of the phase wire (A phase is yellow, B phase is green, and C phase is red). Jumper wires should not be raised more than 3.125" inch, above the board surface, or not above components or leads in such a way that the wires will interfere with circuit board mounting. Practice good wiring: secure.
