

How much spacing should be between cables in a cable tray



Article Overview

Cables inside a tray should generally maintain at least one cable diameter of spacing between adjacent cables, with additional separation for power and signal cables to reduce EMI and allow heat dissipation.

General Spacing Guidelines

- Same-circuit cables: Maintain a minimum spacing of one cable diameter between adjacent cables of the same circuit to ensure proper ampacity and prevent overheating .
- Power vs. signal/control cables: Keep a minimum horizontal or vertical separation of 300 mm (12 inches) between power and signal cables to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to less than 0.3 meters .
- Vertical spacing between trays: For floor-mounted or stacked trays, maintain at least 150 mm (6 inches) of vertical clearance to allow airflow, future expansion, and maintenance access .
- Horizontal spacing between parallel trays: When installing two trays side by side, maintain a minimum distance of 0.6 meters (24 inches) for safe access and heat dissipation .

Installation Considerations

- Circuit grouping: Single-conductor cables should be installed in circuit groups to prevent inductive heating and maintain tray efficiency .
