

How to remove the pigtail cable from your home

Safely removing a pigtail cable involves confirming it is inactive, using proper tools, carefully detaching it from walls or ceilings, and sealing any entry points.

Safety First

Before touching any cable, identify whether it is low-voltage or high-voltage. Pigtail cables, coaxial, and phone lines are typically low-voltage (under 50 volts) and safe to handle once disconnected from the service provider, but high-voltage electrical lines (120–240V) must only be handled by a licensed electrician. Always confirm the cable is completely inactive using a non-contact voltage tester (NCVT) and, if necessary, contact your service provider to verify the line is abandoned.

Tools and Preparation

Gather the following tools and safety equipment:

- Sturdy ladder (positioned using the “1 in 4” rule for stability)
 - Insulated cable cutters or diagonal pliers
 - Safety glasses
 - Heavy-duty work gloves
 - Utility knife and fish tape for tracing cables inside walls
- Ensure the workspace is clear, and if working at height, follow ladder safety guidelines.
