

How to secure the 8-core terminal box pigtail



Article Overview

Secure 8-core terminal box pigtails by properly routing, splicing, and fixing each fiber in the splice tray, ensuring minimal stress and firm connections to the adapters.

Step 1: Prepare the Terminal Box and Pigtails

- Open the terminal box and identify the splice trays and adapter ports for the 8-core fibers .
- Ensure the pigtail cables match the fiber type and connector (SC, LC, FC) supported by the box .
- Check that the pigtail fibers are 0.9mm OD or compatible with the box's routing channels .

Step 2: Route the Fibers

- Carefully route each pigtail along the internal cable management paths to avoid sharp bends. Maintain a minimum bend radius as specified by the fiber manufacturer.
- Use the cable entry points to guide incoming fibers into the box without kinking or stressing the fibers .
- Keep fibers organized and separated to prevent tangling and reduce signal loss.

Step 3: Splice the Pigtails

- Place the fibers into the splice tray. If using fusion splicing, align the fiber ends precisely and perform the splice according to the splicer's instructions .
