

How to tie a knot in fiber optic cable

Fiber optic cables should be tied using secure, low-stress knots like the cable knot or cable stitch, ensuring the strength members are properly managed to prevent damage.

Recommended Knots

1. Cable Knot (Cable Stitch or Cable Splice) The cable knot is a strong, reliable knot used to secure fiber optic cables during installation or bundling. It is particularly effective for managing the strength members (Kevlar or fiberglass rods) without putting stress on the delicate optical fibers inside . To tie a cable knot:
 - Prepare the cable by separating the strength members from the jacket.
 - Create a loop with the cable or strength members.
 - Pass the working end through the loop, wrap around the standing part, and tighten.
 - Tape the strength members along the jacket to secure the knot and prevent slippage .
2. Bowline Knot The bowline knot creates a secure loop at the end of a cable. It is useful when you need to attach a fiber optic cable to a fixed point without compressing the fibers .
3. Figure-Eight Knot This knot is ideal for joining two cables together or forming a stopper knot. It distributes tension evenly and reduces the risk of kinking the fiber .
4. Alpine Butterfly Knot Used for creating a loop in the middle of a cable run, the alpine butterfly knot is strong and allows for multiple attachment points without stressing the cable .
