

How to use an industrial signal switch

Understanding Industrial Signal Switches

An industrial signal switch is a device that opens or closes an electrical circuit, producing a binary signal (ON or OFF) that can be read by a controller such as a PLC or DCS . These switches are commonly used to monitor physical parameters like pressure, temperature, liquid level, or flow. When a threshold is reached, the switch changes state, sending a signal to the control system to trigger alarms, start/stop equipment, or log events .

Types of Industrial Signal Switches

- **Pressure Switches:** Activate when a specific pressure is reached, often used in hydraulic or pneumatic systems .
- **Level Switches:** Detect liquid or solid levels in tanks or silos, including float or capacitive types .
- **Flow and Temperature Switches:** Trigger signals when flow rates or temperatures exceed set limits .
- **Digital Input Switches:** Interface with PLCs using 24V DC or AC signals, often with galvanic isolation for safety .

Using a Signal Switch

- **Installation:** Mount the switch according to manufacturer specifications, ensuring proper alignment with the monitored parameter (e.g., pressure port, tank level).
