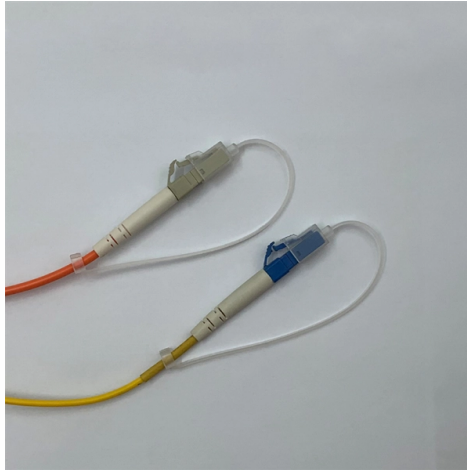

Answer: Yes; cables are tied down in cable trays to keep the cables in the cable tray, to maintain spacing between cables, or to segregate or confine certain types of cables to specific locations. Fill Limits: For power cables, the fill must not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area; for control cables, it's 50%. If we do not plan well, we see many problems. Fixing a fault becomes hard if cables are everywhere. Bad design also brings safety risks, like fire from hot cables.
