A core switch is a specialized, high-performance switch positioned at the backbone or core layer of a hierarchical network, responsible for routing and switching large volumes of data between distribution switches and other network segments . Unlike access switches, which connect directly to end-user devices, core switches aggregate traffic from lower layers and provide ultra-low latency and high throughput to ensure smooth data flow across the network .

Key Characteristics of Core Switches

- **Layer 3 Functionality:** Core switches often operate at Layer 3, enabling IP routing between VLANs, subnets, and security zones .
- **High Capacity and Performance:** They are designed to handle massive traffic loads with minimal latency, supporting port speeds from 10G to 400G+ and large buffers for bursty traffic .
- **Redundancy and Reliability:** Core switches include features like dual power supplies, hot-swappable modules, and link aggregation to maintain network stability .
- **Scalability:** Modular or stackable designs allow networks to expand without replacing the core switch .
