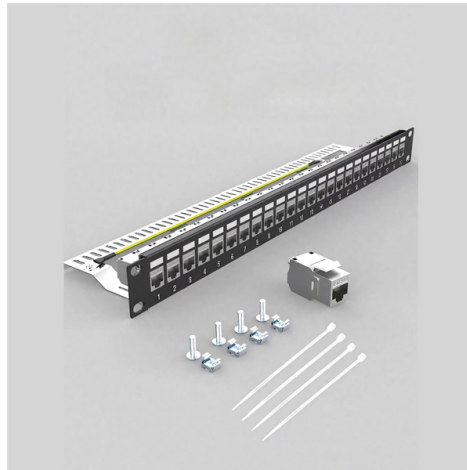

Zoning a fibre channel network at the switch level provides a security boundary that ensures host devices do not see. Zoning is enforced by examining the source-destination ID field.
