

No excavation is allowed on either side of the underground fiber optic cable

No excavation should occur within at least 18 to 24 inches on either side of an underground fiber optic cable to prevent damage and ensure safety.

Tolerance Zone Guidelines

Underground fiber optic cables are highly sensitive and can be easily damaged by excavation. To protect these utilities, a tolerance zone is established around the cable. This zone typically extends 18 to 24 inches (approximately 1.5 to 2 feet) on either side of the cable's outer edge, depending on local regulations and utility company guidelines . Within this zone, excavation must be approached with extreme caution.

Safe Excavation Practices

- **Locate and Mark Utilities:** Before any digging, contact your local utility locating service (e.g., 811 in the U.S.) to have the fiber optic cable accurately located and marked . Markings may fade over time, so repeated verification may be necessary.
- **Hand Digging or Soft Excavation:** Within the tolerance zone, mechanical excavation tools should generally be avoided. Use hand tools, soft digging, potholing, or vacuum excavation to minimize the risk of damaging the cable .
- **Maintain Clear Communication:** Ensure all contractors and workers are aware of the cable location and the tolerance zone. Use utility maps and real-time monitoring tools if available .
