

Outdoor cables should not be placed in cable trays



Overview

Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if they meet NEC requirements. Fill Limits: For power cables, the fill must not exceed 40% of the tray's. Employers can be cited for violating the General Duty Clause if there is a recognized hazard and they do not take reasonable steps to prevent or abate the hazard. Citations can.
