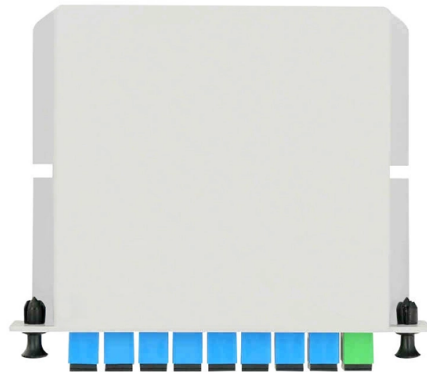

A primary box is typically the first point of fiber termination in a network, often located at the central office or main distribution frame. Its main function is to receive feeder fibers from the backbone network and provide a secure environment for splicing, organizing, and routing these fibers toward secondary distribution points. Primary boxes often house splitters, splice trays, and patch panels, enabling high-density fiber management and facilitating network scalability .

Secondary Box

A secondary box acts as an intermediate distribution node between the primary box and the end-user connections. These boxes are usually installed in building corridors, stairways, or outdoor community areas. Their primary role is to distribute fibers from the feeder cables to multiple subscriber lines, often using PLC splitters or splice trays to manage multiple connections efficiently. Secondary boxes help reduce cable congestion and simplify maintenance in multi-dwelling units or dense residential areas .
