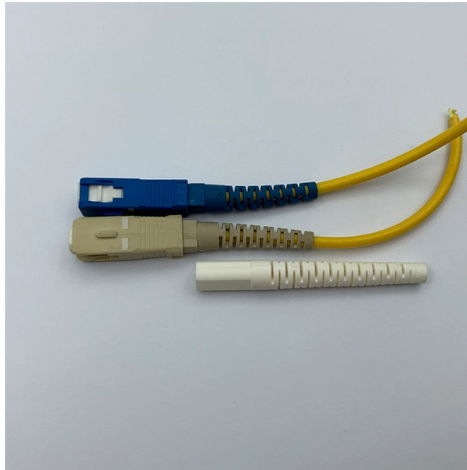


Rainwater seeping into the cable tray
