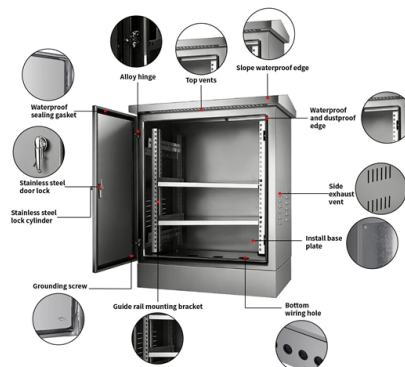


Requirements for electrical distribution boxes in secondary buildings



Article Overview

Electrical distribution boxes in secondary buildings must comply with NEC standards, be installed in accessible, dry locations, and include proper protection, grounding, and clearances for safe operation.

Location and Accessibility

Distribution boxes should be installed in dry, accessible areas with good ventilation, typically at a height of around 1.5 meters (5 feet) for ease of operation and maintenance. They must be readily accessible, with a minimum working space of 30 inches wide, 36 inches deep, and 6.5 feet high in front of the panel, and the door should open fully to 90°. The area in front of the panel must remain clear and not be used for storage.

Enclosure and Environmental Protection

The enclosure must protect internal components from dust, water, and physical damage. For indoor installations, standard NEMA or IP-rated boxes are sufficient, while outdoor installations require rain-tight enclosures (NEMA 3R or 4) to comply with NEC Article 312. Materials are typically steel or durable plastic, and the box should be rated for the expected environmental conditions.
