

Round and Square Tail Fibers

Round and square tail fibers refer to either surfboard tail shapes affecting maneuverability and stability or fiber optic tail connectors used for linking optical networks.

Surfboard Tail Shapes

Round Tail: Round tails are curved and extend farther into the wave, allowing for smooth, drawn-out turns and increased maneuverability. They are versatile and suitable for a variety of wave conditions, providing a looser feel but slightly less stability and hold compared to angular tails. Surfers often choose round tails for boards that need to perform well in both small and large surf, emphasizing flow and control.

Square/Squash Tail: Square tails have a straight back with angular corners, offering more surface area for stability and sharper, more pivotal turns. The squash tail is a rounded variation of the square tail, combining maneuverability with stability, making it ideal for shortboards and small to medium waves. Wider square or squash tails allow easier rail-to-rail movement, while narrower versions provide more grip in turns.
