- **Durability:** Many ST patch cords are designed with Kevlar strength members and rugged jackets, making them suitable for indoor and outdoor use, resistant to water, UV, and mechanical stress.
- **Plenum and Riser Ratings:** Options include OFNP (plenum-rated) and OFNR (riser-rated) jackets for compliance with building fire codes.
