

Safety Issues When Laying Fiber Optic Cables

Laying fiber optic cables is generally safe if proper precautions are taken, but it carries risks such as eye injury from infrared light, cuts from glass shards, and cable damage from environmental or mechanical stress.

Physical Hazards

Fiber optic cables do not carry electricity and are not a heat source, so electrocution and fire are not primary concerns. However, the real dangers come from handling the fibers themselves. When fibers are stripped, cut, or terminated, they produce microscopic glass shards that can penetrate the skin and are difficult to remove. These shards can also contaminate food or surfaces, potentially causing serious internal injuries if ingested. Proper disposal of fiber scraps using tape or dedicated containers is essential to prevent accidents.

Eye Safety

Fiber optic cables transmit light, often in the infrared spectrum (1300–1550 nm), which is invisible to the naked eye. Direct exposure to this light can harm the cornea or lens, though it is unlikely to penetrate the retina. Using microscopes or optical instruments without infrared filters increases the risk of eye injury. Technicians should never look directly into a fiber unless they are certain no light is being transmitted.
