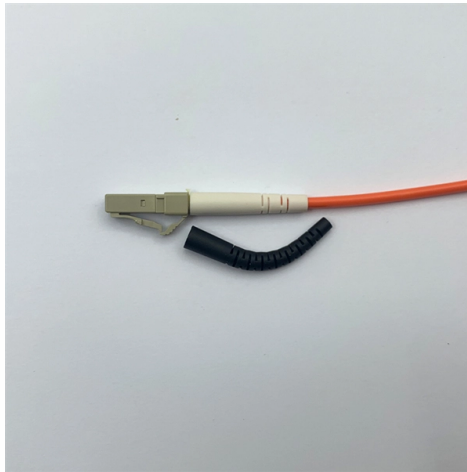


Single-mode fiber optic cables in black and yellow

Color Significance

- **Yellow Jacket:** Universally identifies single-mode fiber with a 9 μm core, suitable for long-distance, high-speed transmission using laser light sources. Yellow is standard for both indoor (OS1) and outdoor (OS2) single-mode fibers, making it easy to distinguish from multimode fibers, which use orange, aqua, or lime green jackets .
- **Black Jacket:** Commonly used for outdoor, UV-resistant, or armored single-mode cables. Black jackets protect the fiber from sunlight and environmental exposure, and the fiber type is usually printed on the jacket for identification . Black can also indicate hybrid or composite cables containing multiple fiber types.

Applications

- **Yellow Single-Mode Cables:** Ideal for telecom backbones, data centers, and long-distance indoor installations. They are often tight-buffered for easy termination and patching .
- **Black Single-Mode Cables:** Designed for outdoor aerial, duct, or direct-buried installations, providing durability against UV, moisture, and mechanical stress. They may be armored or plenum-rated depending on the environment .
