

Spacing between cable trays and supports in Sudan



Article Overview

Cable trays should be spaced and supported according to international standards, with horizontal support spans of 1.5–3 meters, vertical clearances of at least 150 mm, and minimum distances between parallel trays of 0.6 meters.

Horizontal and Vertical Spacing

For horizontal runs, cable trays should be supported at intervals ranging from 1.5 to 3 meters depending on the tray type, load, and cable weight. Ladder-type trays typically follow a support span of 4–6 feet (1.2–1.8 meters) as recommended by the NEC, while perforated or wire mesh trays may require closer spacing for stability and ventilation. For vertical spacing, the minimum clearance between floor-mounted trays or between stacked trays should be 150 millimeters. This ensures proper airflow for heat dissipation, allows for future cable additions, and prevents interference between cables.

Spacing Between Parallel Trays

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, maintain a minimum distance of 0.6 meters to allow maintenance access, inspection, and adequate ventilation. For power and signal cable trays, a minimum separation of 0.5 meters is recommended to reduce electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to 0.3 meters.
