

Stacking two core switches



Article Overview

You can stack two core switches using dedicated stack ports or StackWise Virtual to operate as a single logical switch with redundancy and centralized management.

Overview of Switch Stacking

Stacking allows multiple physical switches to function as a single logical switch, simplifying management, increasing redundancy, and aggregating bandwidth between switches . In a two-switch stack, one switch is designated as the active (master) and the other as the standby, ensuring seamless failover if the active switch fails . StackWise Virtual extends this concept by connecting two physical switches via a StackWise Virtual Link (SVL), synchronizing control plane information and providing high availability .

Physical Setup

- **Verify Compatibility:** Ensure both switches are stack-capable and running the same IOS version and feature set .
- **Connect Stack Cables:** Use the dedicated stack ports on the back of each switch. For StackWise Virtual, connect the two switches using the SVL interfaces .
- **Power On Sequence:** Power on the switch intended to be the master first, then power on the second switch. This ensures proper stack member numbering and master election .
- **Topology:** For two switches, a simple ring topology is recommended to provide redundancy, though a single link is sufficient for basic stacking .
