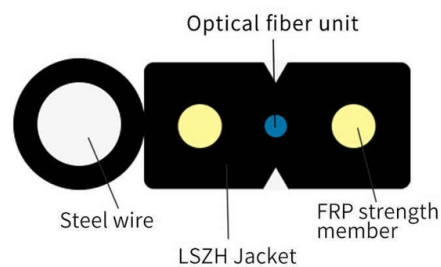


Standard Configuration of Core Switches



Article Overview

Core switches are configured with high-capacity hardware, scalable interface modules, redundancy protocols, and advanced features like QoS, security, and link aggregation to ensure reliable backbone network performance.

Key Hardware Parameters

Slots and Module Types: Core switches have multiple slots to accommodate interface and function modules. The number of slots determines the total number of ports and the scalability of the switch. Supported module types include LAN interface modules (RJ-45, SFP, GBIC, 10Gbps), WAN modules, and extension modules for services like IP voice or network monitoring, allowing the switch to adapt to complex network environments . **Backplane Bandwidth:** This is the maximum data transfer capacity between the switch's interface processor and the internal data bus. A higher backplane bandwidth ensures faster inter-port communication and prevents bottlenecks during high-volume traffic .
