

# The color of optical cable represents

The color of an optical cable indicates the fiber type, its purpose, and helps technicians identify individual fibers and connectors for proper installation and maintenance.

### Fiber Jacket Colors

The outer jacket color of a fiber optic cable provides a quick visual cue about the type of fiber inside:

- Yellow: Single-mode fiber (OS1 or OS2), designed for long-distance, high-speed transmission using a 9µm core .
- Orange: Older multimode fibers (OM1 or OM2), typically used for LED light sources and short indoor runs .
- Aqua: Laser-optimized multimode fibers (OM3 or OM4), supporting high-speed short-range data transmission .
- Erika Violet: Sometimes used for OM4 to distinguish it from OM3 in high-density data centers .
- Lime Green: OM5 multimode fiber, designed for wideband applications and high-capacity transmission .

### Individual Fiber Colors

Inside multi-fiber cables, each fiber is color-coded according to the TIA-598-C standard to simplify identification and prevent miswiring:

- Blue
