Optical cables entering a fiber optic distribution frame (ODF) are terminated, organized, and routed to enable secure, efficient, and flexible distribution of optical signals across the network.

Termination and Connection

Incoming optical cables, often trunk or feeder fibers from central offices or other network nodes, are terminated within the ODF using connectors such as LC, SC, or ST types. This termination provides a stable interface for connecting fibers to patch panels or splicing trays, ensuring minimal signal loss and easy access for maintenance or reconfiguration .

Splicing

Within the ODF, incoming fibers may be spliced to distribution fibers using fusion or mechanical splicing. Splices are typically housed in protective trays to prevent physical damage and maintain signal integrity. This process allows the network to branch out from a main fiber line to multiple distribution points .

Patching and Distribution

After termination and splicing, fibers are cross-connected via patch cords to route signals to specific destinations, such as switches, routers, or subscriber lines. This patching capability provides flexibility for network upgrades, rerouting, and troubleshooting without disrupting the main fiber infrastructure .
