

The spacing of cable tray wiring should be appropriate

Cable tray wiring should maintain proper horizontal and vertical spacing, support intervals, and separation between power and signal cables to ensure safety, reduce interference, and allow maintenance.

Horizontal and Vertical Spacing

- Horizontal spacing between power and signal trays should generally be at least 0.5 meters to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to 0.3 meters .
- Vertical spacing between floor-mounted trays or between upper and lower trays should be at least 150 millimeters. This clearance ensures structural integrity, allows for heat dissipation, and facilitates future installation or rearrangement of cables .

Support Spacing

- Support intervals for cable trays depend on the tray type and load. Standard horizontal trays typically require supports every 1.5 to 3 meters, while NEC guidelines suggest 4 to 6 feet (1.2 to 1.8 meters) for ladder-type trays, with a maximum of 5 feet (1.5 meters) for heavy loads .
- For long-span or heavy-duty trays, supports can extend up to 20 feet if the manufacturer's load capacity allows .
- Rungs in ladder-type trays should not exceed 9 inches apart to maintain cable stability .
