

What is the fiber optic signal of a router



Article Overview

The fiber optic signal travels as light through a glass cable to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts it into electrical signals that your router can use to provide internet to your devices.

Signal Path from Fiber to Router

Fiber optic internet delivers data as pulses of light through ultra-thin glass strands, which allows for extremely fast and reliable transmission with minimal signal loss compared to copper cables (). The fiber line enters your home and terminates at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), a small device usually installed near the point of entry, such as on an interior wall or near your electrical panel (). The ONT performs optoelectronic conversion, translating the incoming light signals into standard electrical signals that your router can understand ().

Connecting the Router

Once the ONT converts the signal, it outputs data through a standard Ethernet port. A cable from this port is connected to the WAN or Internet port on your router, which then distributes the internet to your devices via Wi-Fi or wired connections (). In some setups, the ONT and router may be combined into a single device, simplifying the connection ().
