

What level is the electrical distribution box on the construction site



Article Overview

Construction sites typically use a three-level distribution box system: primary (main), secondary (sub), and tertiary (equipment-level) boxes.

Overview of the Three-Level System

Construction sites adopt a tiered power distribution model to safely and efficiently deliver electricity from the main supply to various equipment and temporary facilities . The system consists of:

- Primary Distribution Box (Level I)
 - Acts as the main hub for incoming three-phase power from the transformer .
 - Equipped with main circuit isolation, main circuit breaker, and main fuse .
 - Connects to secondary distribution boxes and includes a metering system.
 - Typically located near the main power supply and designed for outdoor, rainproof use .
- Secondary Distribution Box (Level II)
 - Receives power from the primary box and redistributes it to multiple switch boxes or tertiary boxes .
 - Includes general isolation, circuit breakers, and fuses for branch circuits .
 - Installed in areas with concentrated electrical equipment, ensuring the distance to switch boxes does not exceed 30 meters .
