The unit of an optical fiber cable is commonly called an Optical Network Unit (ONU) or Optical Network Terminal (ONT).

In fiber-optic communication, the optical fiber cable itself is an assembly of one or more optical fibers enclosed in protective layers, designed to carry light signals over distances for data transmission . While the cable is the physical medium, the unit that interfaces with the end-user or network equipment is typically called an Optical Network Unit (ONU) or Optical Network Terminal (ONT) . These devices receive the optical signal from the service provider and convert it into electrical signals usable by routers, computers, or other devices.

Key Points About ONU/ONT

- ONU (Optical Network Unit): Often serves multiple users in a building or shared network scenario. It connects to the Optical Line Terminal (OLT) at the provider's end and distributes the signal to subscribers .
- ONT (Optical Network Terminal): Usually serves a single subscriber, performing the same optical-to-electrical conversion as an ONU. In practice, many ISPs use the terms interchangeably .
