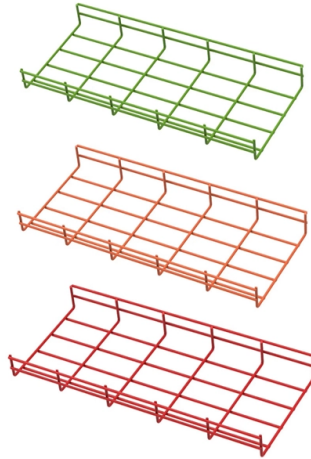

Busbars: Copper busbars are the primary components in distribution boxes that carry and distribute electricity to multiple circuits. They are thick, solid strips of copper designed to handle high current loads efficiently with minimal resistance, making them the densest concentration of copper in the box .

Main Incoming Power Lines: The wires bringing electricity from the utility or main supply into the distribution box are typically copper. These lines are often thicker than branch circuit wires to safely carry the full load of the building's electrical system .

Terminals and Connection Points: Copper is also used at terminals where wires are attached to breakers, fuses, or busbars. These points require reliable conductivity and corrosion resistance, which copper provides .
