

Where to connect the other end of the pigtail



Article Overview

The free end of a pigtail wire should be connected to the corresponding terminal on the device, following standard color coding: black to brass (hot), white to silver (neutral), and green or bare to the ground screw.

Step-by-Step Guidance

1. Identify the pigtail type and color:

- Black (hot) pigtail connects to the brass-colored terminal screw.
- White (neutral) pigtail connects to the silver-colored terminal screw.
- Green or bare (ground) pigtail connects to the green grounding screw on the device or box .

2. Prepare the wire end:

- Strip about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of insulation from the pigtail if not already exposed.
- Form a small clockwise hook (J-hook) at the end using needle-nose pliers. This ensures the wire wraps under the screw in the same direction it tightens, preventing it from slipping out .

3. Connect to the device:

- Place the hooked end under the appropriate terminal screw.
 - Tighten the screw firmly to ensure a secure electrical connection.
 - For devices with push-in terminals, insert the stripped wire end fully into the slot if allowed by the manufacturer .
- #### 4. Fold and secure wires in the box:
- Carefully fold the connected wires in an accordion fashion to avoid strain.
