

Wires and cables can share the same cable tray



Article Overview

Power and low-voltage or communication cables can share the same cable tray only under strict conditions, with proper separation, shielding, and compliance with NEC and IEC standards.

Regulatory Guidelines

According to the National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 300.3(C)(1), mixing power and low-voltage cables in the same tray is generally prohibited unless specific separation or shielding requirements are met. Similarly, IEC 60364-5-52 recommends physical separation or shielding to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI) between high-voltage and sensitive low-voltage cables. NEC Article 392 also governs cable tray installations, specifying fill limits, grounding, and support requirements for safe operation.

Risks of Co-Locating Cables

- **Electromagnetic Interference (EMI):** Power cables generate magnetic fields that can disrupt signals in communication or instrumentation cables.
- **Voltage Induction:** High-voltage cables may induce unwanted voltages in nearby low-voltage circuits, potentially damaging equipment.
- **Fire Hazards:** Overcrowding or improper grouping of cables can lead to overheating and increased fire risk.
- **Signal Integrity Issues:** Data transmission may be compromised if low-voltage cables are too close to power conductors.
